Biographical Sketch or Administrative History

Assignment lists were used to inform sisters of their assignments for the coming year. Every years in the summer, assignment lists were posted on the bulletin board in the community room of the motherhouse. Copies were also sent to and displayed at each convent house. After afternoon prayer, lists were posted so sisters could see where they would be ministering at the end of the summer. Beginning in the late 1960s or early 1970s, sisters received letters in the mail from Council to inform them of their new assignments.

Community lists organized sisters according to their rank. A sisters' rank was determined by the length of time she had been in the community. For groups of sisters that entered together, rank was further determined by the age of the sister, the older she was, the higher the rank. The prioress and Council, as the leaders of the community, was given the highest ranks regardless of when they entered. Former prioresses received the first rank after councilors.

Community lists were not distributed to individual sisters or convents, but every sister knew her rank and who was just above or below her. Sisters sat for meals in the refectory according to rank. Where sisters sat in chapel was also determined by their rank. Even where sisters slept was often determined by rank. When sisters lived in convents with dorm-style sleeping arrangement (one room with several beds separated by curtains), sisters' assigned beds changed when their rank changed. Ranks changed when other sisters died, left, or entered the community.

Sometime between 1967 and 1971, rank was no longer use. Community lists were then organized by age or alphabetically.
